

1. GENERAL POLICY GOVERNING COMPUTER AND INTERNET USE

The Urbana Free Library views its public computers, peripherals, accompanying software, and the Internet as resources that help to meet the informational, educational, and recreational needs of its public.

Public computers and associated resources are available to all users of The Urbana Free Library. Select groups of public computers are limited by age, or need, of the user.

2. POLICY ENFORCEMENT

The Library staff are specifically authorized and instructed to:

- Develop rules and procedures as necessary to insure the fair and reasonable use of the Library's public computers and Internet resources.
- Observe the use made of Library equipment and patron-owned devices for the purpose of enforcing Library policies and procedures.
- Suspend public computer access for users found in violation of Library policies or procedures, including Rules of Behavior.

3. COPYRIGHT

U.S. Copyright Law (Title 17, U.S. Code) and the Digital Millennium Copyright Act of 1998 prohibit the unauthorized reproduction or distribution of copyrighted material, except as permitted by the principle of "fair use." The Library expressly disclaims any liability or responsibility resulting from reproduction or distribution of copyrighted content by any method in any format. While staff are available to assist users with printing, copying, scanning, or downloading content, staff assistance does not imply copyright permission. Staff members can refuse assistance when to do so would, in their best judgment, involve a violation of federal copyright laws and regulations. The user is responsible for copyright compliance and assumes any liability for copyright violation.

4. LIMITS ON LIABILITY

People using public computers and/or accessing the Internet do so at their own risk.
