Biographical Note:

Gilbert Papp was born to Steven and Ann (Klein) Papp on January 9, 1934 in Joliet, Illinois. As a young man he excelled as a band member, playing the clarinet in grade school and high school in Joliet. Following high school, he enlisted in the Army in 1951. After being honorably discharged, he received his bachelor's and master's degrees in music from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Gilbert Papp taught music in Champaign-Urbana from 1959-1971 before moving to Monticello where he revitalized the marching band team, the Marching Sages, and led them to multiple award-winning seasons. On the national level, his Marching Sages won the National Championship in Whitewater, Wisconsin in 1978. Later that same year, they played the Orange Bowl in Miami Gardens, Florida.

Scope and Content Note:

The collection spans the course of Gilbert Papp's life focusing on: his youth as a clarinetist, his time in the Army, and, primarily, his time as a music instructor and marching band director. Materials include photocopies of three scrapbooks covering Gill Papp's instruction of the Marching Sages which are identified by the school year. A fourth scrapbook of the same nature has been placed in an oversized box. These scrapbooks are made up of photographs, correspondence, newspaper clippings, and posters. Also present are Gilbert Papp's diplomas from UIUC, personal papers collected from his grade school years at Joliet, photocopied photographs, newspaper clippings, and personal correspondence. There is a separate box of music scores with Papp's personal notes, which has been left in its original arrangement.

Arrangement:

One Hundred Years with the Fortnightly Club, 1985-1995: A Supplement to Ninety Years with the Fortnightly Club of Urbana, 1895-1985 is cataloged and located in our print materials collection.

Pulled from the collection were metal awards for Gill Papp's clarinet playing in his youth, two vinyl records, two DVDs, two CDs, and one VHS tape, all of the Monticello Marching Sages a personal notebook (blank), and a CD of Northern Colorado University Marching band music. Also pulled and placed in the Special Collection Photographs series are the photographs from this collection which cover Gill Papp's childhood, his time in the Army, his time as an instructor, and the Marching Sages members, and formations.
