Biographical/Historical Note:

Founded in 1973 by Marilyn Kay, The Reading Group is a not-for-profit organization, which provides educational services to individuals with dyslexia, learning disabilities, and those struggling with illiteracy. Marilyn Kay, with the help of Lou Brown and Mary Hart, provided one-on-one instruction to children with learning disabilities from the instructors' homes. By 1978, the group moved to a storefront at 900 Race St. in Urbana and the group provided additional services such as workshops and training programs.

In 1988, The Reading Group was incorporated as a not-for-profit reading clinic and a board of directors was elected. An increasing number of staff members warranted a move to seven rooms in the lower level of Lincoln Square Mall in Urbana. In 1995, the rooms underwent an expansion and remodel, which included the addition of a computer lab and a large meeting space.

Scope and Content Note:

This collection documents the organization and activities of the Reading Group from 1972-2004, with the majority of documents created during and after the organization's incorporation as a nonprofit in 1987. This event is heavily documented within the collection, as it prompted major organizational changes and collaboration with other institutions. Other available records include those detailing organizational structure, activities of the board of directors and committees, financial history, specific events and programs, media coverage, and publications. Photographs of events and individuals supplement the textual records.

Rich information about the Reading Group's approach to teaching students with reading difficulties or reading or learning disabilities may be found throughout the records, particularly in Series 8, 10, and 13, which includes audiovisual materials documenting events, interviews, and student perspectives. This information comes in the form of informal notes, handouts, publications, etc., and helps contextualize

the Reading Group and its services as well as offering a broader perspective on the history of reading education. The leadership and influence of Marilyn Kay, co-founder and director of the Reading Group until 2004, is evident throughout the collection, particularly in Series 8 and 12.

The collection currently includes records that are not in regular use by the Reading Group, and additional records will continue to be added in the future. Any records that may impinge on the privacy of former students of the Reading Group have been excluded from the records except in cases where permission was originally given (e.g. images that appear in newsletters). Extraneous or irrelevant documents, including some financial records, have also been discarded.

Arrangement:

Marilyn Kay was responsible for the initial collection of archival records and their arrangement in 2010-2011. The final arrangement of the records reflects Kay's general organization and was completed with her guidance, and the original order of institutional files has been maintained wherever it was apparent. When doing so facilitated easier access and clarified the development of the Reading Group, records have been reordered chronologically at the item level. Loose folders and items have been interfiled within relevant series.

The collection is divided into two series: Administrative records and Programming and Events. Each series is organized by record type, then chronologically.
