Historical Note:

The Savoy Methodist Church traces its beginnings to 1860, when A. J. Jutkins gave the first Methodist sermon at the Illinois Central railway depot. Parishioners met informally at the depot, in a nearby grove, and in private homes until 1869, when a Sunday school was formed, with Merton Dunlap as its founding superintendent.

The Illinois Annual Conference, the state-level administrative arm of the Methodist Church, formally recognized Savoy as a regular meeting place. The first Board of Trustees was elected on Dec. 26, 1885, comprised of C.E. Percival (secretary), J. Hamil Dunlap (president), Daniel Burwash, D.H. Henshie, W.H. Wisegarver (treasurer), and Albert Dunlap.

In May 1886, the President of the Board, J.H. Dunlap, donated land for the construction of a church building. A tornado on September 16, 1886, "the big wind," according to the church records, destroyed the half-built church, causing \$500-\$700 worth of damage. A new building was completed quickly, and dedicated on January 9, 1887. A parsonage was added in 1891. Both burned down on February 10, 1895. A new church building was again constructed quickly, and dedicated on September 22, 1895. The new church was built on land E.S. Dunlap purchased and resold to the trustees for that purpose.

The Savoy Methodist Church, now the Savoy United Methodist Church (name changed in 1970), is currently [2017] located at 3002 W. Old Church Road in Champaign, Illinois.

Scope and Content Note:

This collection includes early handwritten accounts of the church's history by its pastors, which later became the basis for the church's official histories. The rest of the records include member rolls, marriages, baptisms, and member departures for other communities. Some financial records for the church are also present including documentation from the 1895 fire rebuilding costs.



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Some records contain references to members of the Dunlap family and their involvement in the church and larger community.

Versions of the historical narratives based on these records are reprinted in three publications at the Champaign County Historical Archives: *Savoy Methodist Church 1849-1959, 125th Anniversary Celebration, Sunday, October 22, 1995*, and *Short History of Savoy, IL*.

Each folder contains a photocopied church record book and related documents. Folders are arranged chronologically based on earliest date in the records it contains.
