Entering the library from Race Street, the first item encountered is the coffee shop which obstructs the experience. (The carpeting in front of the counter is worn.) Overall, interior traffic flow and taking advantage of open spaces does not seem optimal. Clutter and the removal of items in temporary (COVID-19 related) storage do not enhance the visual experience. Approximately 75% of library space appears to be devoted to print/other physical material. In this digital age, can't we convert a significant portion (if not the bulk) of this material to electronic. From a vehicular vantage, I find the parking areas piecemeal and access to spaces somewhat difficult. And then there are the meters. (The Champaign Public Library parking is unmetered.) The outdoor book drops are somewhat hazardous and access somewhat difficult. Even having a greater than average arm reach, negotiating books and other items into the drops is not without extra effort. And then there is the curbing, at and after the drops. (I am reminded of a Wii entertainment system.) When I park on the street (such as Cedar Street the block south of Green), I find no convenient path to the library.
